Editor's Corner

"We must protect patients, but we must also find better ways to protect professionals. If we do not, medical progress will cease, particularly in controversial and distressing area"-THE LANCET (Vol 367, April 1-7, 2006).

The above article published in Lancet over a decade ago, is ever so relevant today. The recent times have witnessed an alarming rise in incidents of rampant vandalism on hospitals and unprovoked violence against doctors and hospital personnel, disrupting the health care machinery and stabbing the morale of the hapless individuals victimized.

The Kerala Healthcare Service Persons & Healthcare Service Institutions Act 2012 (Prevention of Violence & Damage to Property), was passed to prohibit violence against healthcare service persons and prevent damage and loss of property in healthcare institutions. Five years have passed since this law was passed, yet a lot is still left to be desired regarding it's stringent enforcement.

The latest unfortunate incident in the capital city is yet another eye opener for each member of the profession, and calls for an individual commitment to stand together to strengthen the association and to maintain the sanctity and tranquility of our workplace environment, so that people look up to hospitals as temples of healing, and not otherwise.

Sensational media coverage of such incidents, often rooted in half truths, worsens the distrust among public towards the medical profession. Society should voice its concern against such organized crime, and doctor's commitment and perseverance for the care and happiness of others has to be appreciated. The media and local political leadership needs to be more sensitive to such issues, and take a more proactive role in making civil society understand how violence against hospitals and doctors adversely affects the health sector at large. Such atrocities cannot be tolerated anymore.

Down Memory Lane.... with Dr. C.v. Prathapan

Dr Biju Nelson, our branch President and Dr Joseph Cardoz desired that I may write a few lines in our IMA Newsletter. I am happy and most grateful since I had long been associated with our branch publication when I was President of the branch, as well as the Editor in the Editorial board. Well, according to chronological ageing humans are classified into different groups. Those above sixty years of age are known as elderly people. They are in the category of young old. Old is the group above seventy years and those above eighty years are categorized as oldest old. I belong to the old old group.



By birth, I am a native of central Travancore, exactly speaking Kottayam is my birth town. I migrated from Kottayam to Kollam after I married Dr. M Santhakumary, a native of Kollam proper. Dr. Santhakumari was a pediatrician who was actively involved in IMA. She had held official posts in IMA and IMA WIMA, Kollam was adjudged the best branch in Kerala state in consecutive years when she was the President. Unfortunately she left this world leaving behind our three children with me-Dr. Thara, Dr. Sindhu and Dr. Prasanth. Dr. Thara is a senior consultant at Lakeshore hospital Cochin and now she is the president of WIMA Madhya Kerala IMA branch. She is active in IMA Ernakulam district.

My education was at CMS College Kottayam and then at SB College, Changanaserry. I passed MBBS from Trivandrum in the year 1963. Later I took DPH and DA from the same college and D' Orth from Calicut Medical College. I joined defense service in 1964. During the course of my defense and Kerala health service, I had undergone many training programs in administration and specialty. I was fortunate to have a short stay at Singapore during which I had worked in Mt. Elizabeth hospital for a few months. During my defense service for ten years from 1964 I had great experience in holding various special posts like RMO infantry battalion, ADS commander, general duty medical officer in major hospital and military establishments. I had experienced war services during Indo-Pak war in 1965. In Lahore sector, our formation crossed the Indo Pak Border and advanced 4kms into Pakistan land capturing up to 4kms of Lahore cantonment. For taking part in the war, I was awarded two war medals-"Rajya Raksha Medal" and "Sainya Seva Medal". I was also eligible for Sikkim medal for my defense service in Sikkim at high altitude snow bound area. I was RMO of infantry battalion. The formation was located at a height of 11,000 feet from sea level bound by snow at a temperature of minus 4 degree to minus eleven degree centigrade. The life was adventurous and challenging. India's highest peak and third highest peak of the world, Kanchenjunga was directly visible close on the other side of the camp site. During the so called Bangladesh internal war, large number of refugees came to India and many camps were established to rehabilitate them. Providing medical relief to them was a difficult task. There was a dearth of medical professionals especially doctors to conduct medical relief services. I had volunteered and joined the medical team. The life in the refugee camp was hard and miserable beyond imagination.

During the Indo Pak war in 1973, I had worked in AFMC, Pune, treating the war casualities transferred to AFMC Pune from Military hospitals after initial treatment. I worked in the Neuro Surgical department under the famous Neurosurgeon Major General Virendra Mohan, advisor in Neurosurgery in defense medical service and in Plastic Surgery under Brigadier M R P Sinha, Professor in Plastic Surgery, AFMC. I was a medical officer in charge of officer's ward of Military Hospital Southern Command where wounded officers were admitted.
